<u>9. ENVIRONMENT</u> : Addressing different interests of residents and commercial businesses

Julie Pullen and Aoife Schweppe, both residents of Main Street, attended the meeting to discuss their concerns regarding various issues in Main Street. Amongst these issues are :-

- Noise, pollution, rodents, parking, tables and chairs on Main Street, bin and glass collections very early in the morning
- Youths making a noise in the street until about 11.30, co-incinding with when the last bus leaves Blalerno, then bin and glass collections and deliveries starting around 3.00 a.m., all of which results in very disturbed sleep for residents of Main Street.
- They have emailed CEC many times with no response.
- ASB no police presence police not responding
- Reports put on police priority list for three weeks with no action.
- Tables and chairs on Main Street has Planning Permission been applied for and granted?
- Neil will take up these issues with the police and with the headteacher at BHS.
- CARS AND PARKING : problems with cars dropping children off at nursery and cars parking on both sides of and along the whole length of Main Street.
- Illegal car parking in Main Street do we need the presence of Parking Attendants?

- Neil will arrange a meeting with the Police Commander.
- CEC councilors to arrange a meeting with police, BCC and Main Street residents. The councillors will take up the issues of noise, vermin, tables and chairs with the relevant CEC departments.
- There appears to be some friction between the residents and the business owners in Main Street. There should be an attempt to establish harmony between the residents and business owners.
- "There is no respect of the residents by some of the business owners."
- "Communication and consultation are required."
- BCC to try to mediate a new arrangement for the residents with the businesses.
