8.POLICE: No police report. There have been several complaints re ASB, noise, litter and vermin.

- David Kay, who attended our April meeting to complain about trees being removed, made a complaint about glyphosate being inserted into the tree stumps to seal them. "This is the only way this can be done." He had also reiterated his previous complaint that since the gate in the wall by the "green bridge" will be open all the time, this will leave the cottages and their residents open to vandalism.
- There appears to be disagreement among neighbours in Main Street re tables and chairs on the pavement. Does this require CEC permission?
- Noise from bin and glass collections early in the mornings
- Huge problem of food waste and rubbish left by school children in Main Street and path behind Scotmid. Residents have approached CEC but got nowhere. BCC will take this up with our new councillors
- Problem with rats and vermin: BCC will take this up with the new councillors.
- ASB: Woman was assaulted in Main Street; door was broken.

- W/c 30April/1 May: mob of about 30 youths at the Rugby Club set leaves and wood on fire; fire brigade attended and put the fire out.
- BCC needs to make contact with the police and request that they deal with these complaints and that they attend some of our meetings.
- Phil will contact Sean Scott, senior policeman for Edinburgh.
