7. POLICE - Presentation re NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH by Easton Miller

- Mr Miller came to Blalerno three years ago from Cheltenham where he was involved in NW; he formed a NW group in Kingfisher Park; joined the board of NW Scotland, based in Stirling
- as there is "nothing behind all the NW signs", Mr Miller would like to invigorate NW in Balerno
- Ken Shade used to run a NW scheme; Ken Stephen was heavily involved in setting up a NW scheme in Balerno
- Scottish ALERT system anyone can sign up to this service to receive alerts on whichever subjects you choose, e.g. scam alerts
- Police weren't able to attend recent breakins at Thriepmuir as it was "too remote"

8. CURRENT ISSUES:

- RESILIENCE :
- Concerns were expressed regarding the impact of energy prices on families and businesses
- It was suggested that an audit should be carried out of the venues available in

Balerno to accommodate residents who are unable to afford to heat their homes; audit should start with the buildings that CEC is responsible for.

- Venues could include the community centre, library, churches, rugby club, scout hall could CEC help to co-ordinate this facility?
- BCC needs to be seen to be taking action "before the tsunami hits"
- GREEN BRIDGE: Phil gave an update making progress; on schedule; date of installation - some time in October
- ENVIRONMENT:
- Weeds and vegetation on the verges on the LRW bends Neil has said that he
 will get the weeds and vegetation cleared so that the verge is suitable for walking
 on
- Weeds in Balerno: CEC has a machine which will remove the weeds.
- <u>Signage</u>: Advertising consent has been suspended CEC said that "the correct fee had not been paid". Apparently the fee scales on the website were incorrect!
- MALLENY HOUSE AND GARDEN: Still no tenant.
- MARCHBANK PARK: It is hoped that the upgrade plans will be approved.
- LAND ADJOINING 4 DEANPARK AVENUE: Stephen has heard nothing. "It is to be hoped that this sale will not proceed."
- **DEAN PARK PRIMARY SCHOOL**: An exhibition of the new classroom plans will be held on Friday 9 September in the school.
- 20 MINUTE NEIGHBOURHOOD SCHEME: Urban Studies department at HW University is interested in this project.
- LAND SOUTH OF CAR PARK ON BAVELAW ROAD : Nothing to report
- MAIN STREET ISSUES: PARKING
- Councillors will ask CEC about the possibility of "2 HOUR PARKING" signs being placed in the car parks.
- CEC teams have been out to Main Street but haven't committed to meet BCC members, councillors and business owners regarding the problems of parking and driving in Main Street.
